

Tolerance 360

Call for participants – Training for Youth Workers

25th November – 4th December 2019, Slettestrand, Denmark.

Together with our partners, we are looking for participants from Turkey, Hungary, Finland, Italy, Macedonia, Romania and Denmark.

Summary

“Tolerance 360” is a ten- day training course hosted by European House, Denmark that aims to equip youth workers with a reflective understanding of tolerance and skills to disseminate the acquired reflections through local activities with young people.

The training course will bring together 30 youth workers coming from the participating countries and will take place between the **25th November** and **4th December 2019**, the 25th being arrival day and the 4th being departure day.

The objectives of the project, aimed at training youth workers, are enlisted below;

1. To influence youth workers to encourage young people to appreciate the meaning of culture and tolerance
2. To make youth workers reflect on the importance of cultural tolerance and its relevance among young people
3. To demonstrate to youth workers the results of intolerance of each other’s culture
4. To give youth workers the competence to react to and manage cultural intolerance
5. To train youth workers on how cultural tolerance could be fostered through non-formal education
6. To give youth workers the competence to help in the integration of immigrants

The Training Course will be conducted in English and translation will not be provided. Therefore, the participants are expected to have a good level of English, both written and spoken.

Participants profile

The candidates must fulfil the following criteria:

- Active role in the partner organizations (or closely affiliated) in the field of youth work
- Good command of English, both in speaking and writing
- Availability for the whole duration of the activity
- Willingness to actively participate and to take part in the dissemination and follow-up
- Potential to be positively impacted by the activity
- Actively involved in promoting culture, tolerance and have in their own way helped immigrants to integrate in society

Application and selection procedure

The partner organizations are responsible to nominate participants for the activities. The nominated participants shall complete an application form on the following link:

Participation in the training course is free of charge.

Deadlines

The nominated participants should have completed the application form no later than **October 5th**. Confirmation of the participant selection will be announced by the organizer on **October 10th**. Within 5 days after the selection results are announced, participants must prove that they have purchased their tickets with a copy of the invoice and a copy of the e-ticket.

Travel

The EU contribution for the travel expenses per participant is as follows for the study visit:

Denmark (20-99km)	20€
Denmark (100-500km)	180€
Hungary, Finland, Italy (Treviso), Macedonia, Romania (500-1999km)	275€
Turkey, Italy (Tusa) (2000-2999km)	360€

Distances were calculated with the [distance calculator](#) of the European Commission from the location of each sending organization to the venue.

Participants shall be reimbursed for their travel expenses up to the amount available for their countries and no more than their real costs. Should the travel expenses exceed the contribution available, participants shall cover the extra costs from own resources.

Reimbursement of travel expenses

In order to get reimbursed for their travel expenses, participants shall send the organizer all the originals of travel documentation and invoices. The reimbursements will be made through bank transfers within 45 days after the organizer has received the original documentation by post.

Additionally, the reimbursement will be performed only if the following conditions are met:

1. Participants submit their individual participant report as requested by the European Commission through the Mobility Tool;
2. Participants and their sending organizations send the organizers a proof of dissemination activities.

Insurance

The partner organizations must ensure that participants have a travel insurance covering them for the whole duration of the study visit.

Visa

The partner organizations are responsible for ensuring that the selected participants have their visa to travel to Denmark, if it is required. The partner organizations must ensure that the visa application procedure is started in good time. Upon request the organizers can provide an invitation letter to help with the visa application. The available budget for visa is 80€ per participant from Turkey.

Please keep all receipt and documentation regarding getting the visa.
